When you take into account the comfort factor and correct staging, such as the use of mosquito nets at Safari, it all comes together as a well thought out and practical solution which also pleases the eye."

Further, the décor team has made use of fabrics which are in accord with each individual lodge's surroundings. They have chosen to use fabrics with a high degree of natural fibre content, such as silk, wool, linen and cotton. While manmade yarns improve usability, the team felt that they wanted a more natural look without the bright dye hues that are often associated with these types of fibres.

That being said, the venues are not stuck in their ways and update their décor from time to time. "There are often breakthroughs in technology which allow for greater efficiencies in material handling, such as viscose mixed with linen for a very natural look but improved washability," continues Wright.
