Location

Tintswalo Lapalala is located in the 44,500 hectare malaria-free Lapalala Wilderness Reserve, a short 3.5 hour drive, or a 30-minute charter flight, north of Johannesburg in the greater Waterberg area. Bordered by private game sanctuaries, the sheer expanse of this unspoiled biosphere area results in no light pollution, and dramatic star-gazing on cloudless nights.

Enjoying its sheltered location, the Lapalala Wilderness offers security for the herds of buffalo, black and white rhino, sable and roan antelope that are all bred on the reserve. Twenty-seven kilometres of pristine river meander through the reserve, providing opportunities to boat, fish and swim in the rapids, or simply enjoy the peaceful magnificence of water-rich scenery, teeming with birdlife.

The Tintswalo Lapalala lodge is a tented, eco-friendly camp which is completely off the grid, and solely run by solo power and generators. Travellers can enjoy all the modern comforts of a luxury lodge whilst still experiencing the true beauty of the bush. As there are only two commercial lodges on the reserve, vehicle density is very low, making it one of the most undisturbed safari experiences within the region. The experienced guides and trackers ensure that guests have a high quality, varied and interactive game and wilderness experience.

Lodge Facilities

Traditional cuisine is served in various locations around the lodge, including unforgettable boma dinners enjoyed beneath the sparkling Milky Way, or indulgent al fresco meals shared on the expansive open lodge deck.

Tintswalo Lapalala's main lounge area provides warmth and ambience with its large fireplace, and guests are able to reconnect with home and work via the lodge's free Wi-Fi service. Surrounded on one side by a large relaxation deck overlooking a busy watering hole, guests are invited to take a refreshing dip in the lodge's crystalline swimming pool as they watch herds of game wander by. The Tintswalo Lapalala boutique curio store is brimming with memorabilia and trinkets to take home.

Accommodation

Eight tented suites overlook a large plain with a watering hole that is frequently visited by wildlife. The suites are linked to each other and to the main lodge by raised wooden walk ways.

- 2 super luxury tented suites with a large bedroom, en-suite bathroom with an outdoor shower, lounge area, and a private plunge pool

Child Policy

- Children of all ages are welcome at the lodge, but as it is a predator-rich environment they must be supervised at all times
- Children under the age of 6 are not permitted on game activities unless a private vehicle has been booked. It remains the sole discretion of the guide to allow children between the ages of 3 and 12 on game activities; this is to ensure the safety of the guests and families.
- Children under the age of 16 may not participate in bushwalks.

Packages

Activities (Weather permitting. On offer to 3 night bookings)

- Game drives – Open 4x4 safari vehicles are equipped with radios for communication, ponchos for wet weather and individual blankets for early morning and evening chill, and spot lights for night viewing
- Our experienced guides are “Field Guide Association” accredited and they offer interpretive and educational game drives through the reserve
- Guided drives through the endangered wildlife breeding camps
- Fishing on the 27km untouched Palala River
- Walks to the iron age site to view ancient historical artifacts
- Visit the well-preserved bushman rock paintings
- Bushwalks – Interactive bush walks, insight into our wildlife, fauna, flora and birdlife (bush walks are arranged on request only)
- The guides are accompanied by experienced trackers who offer stories of the local culture and traditions.
- Private birding or photographic safaris are also available on request (extra charge and advanced booking is essential)
- Children’s activity program – Tintswalo guides offer an exciting activity program to keep our young visitors entertained for hours. The children receive a welcome goodie backpack with educational items and “The Little Ranger” activity and story book
- Excursions to the Lapalala Wilderness School can be arranged, where guests may interact with the children and teachers in their quest for conservation of the African bush veld
- Sleep out deck in the reserve (extra charge)
- Picnics along the riverbed
- Barge river cruise along the Palala river for up to 8 guests (extra charge)

Transfer Options Extra Charge

- Local flights from O.R. Tambo, or Grand Central Airport to Vaalwater Airport (45min.)
- Road transfers between Lapalala and Vaalwater Airport (1.5 hours)
- Self-drive or private road transfers from Johannesburg (3.5 hours)
- Eastgate pick up time will be at 13h00 and drop off time at 12h00. Any transfers required outside of these times will be charged R500 per trip at an additional cost.
- Private charters to Lapalala Airstrip are available on request.

Lapalala Wilderness Reserve

The Lapalala reserve was founded in 1981, by conservationists Dale Parker and Clive Walker who wanted to establish the Wilderness wildlife school. It is a pristine, untouched wilderness located in the Waterberg Biosphere and is a protected nature reserve.
